





National Natural Monument of Japan

The Earth Pillars of Awa can be seen as nature's artwork created from centuries of environmental changes. Over time, powerful earthquakes shaped the earth and sand into beautiful pillars that can be found only at two other locations in the world. Heavy rains have also formed the vertical shapes of the pillars—a process that still continues today. This terrain is admired by many and holds the prestigious nomination of a National Natural Monument in Japan.

On October 10th 1956, famous artist Kiyoshi Yamashita found inspiration for this piece while visiting the Earth Pillars of Awa.




Poet Ujou Noguchi's Engraved Poem

Tarai Udon: Thick wheat flour noodles served in a wooden bucket A specialty of Gosho

Tarai Udon is a dish that represents Awa City the best. The dish is traditionally served in a wooden bucket and should be eaten with a light broth soup on the side as a dip for the noodles. Tarai Udon noodles are made from wheat, and they were the most popular in the area of Gosho in Donari Town due to the dry lands that were not favorable for rice farming. In the past, many watermills were built and installed along the Miyagochidani-Gawa which allowed people to make udon noodles and use them as a source of food in that region. On New Year's and during religious events, people would prepare and serve themselves directly from the big wooden bucket. This custom is still practiced today and people in Awa are proud of their unique way of eating udon. Route 318 hosts multiple Tarai Udon restaurants located close to the river, allowing customers to feel the fresh air and to enjoy the nice view of the water circulating through the dam.





One of the main attractions of Shikoku, the Pilgrimage of the 88 Buddhist temples, was established in 815 by Kukai. In Awa City, you can visit four of the eighty-eight temples: a year-round attraction in which many people find pleasure in discovering. The city hosts temples number 7 (Juraku-Ji), 8 (Kumadani-Ji), 9 (Horin-Ji) and 10 (Kirihata-Ji). During the spring, visitors can admire the city's cherry blossoms, hydrangeas and cosmos as they walk through the natural gardens and marvelous architecture of the Pilgrimage. Those who visit during the fall will be enchanted by the elegant decor created by autumn's leaves.

Furthermore, traveling through Awa City is very convenient—especially for those on the Pilgrimage-since the roads and paths are accessible for everyone. People can observe wild flowers, navigate through the countless rice fields, and cross unique submersible bridges above the Yoshino River. Pilgrims will surely remember the hospitality of osettai (Shikoku's hospitality) which they will experience throughout their journey.









Awa City grows the finest vegetables in large part to its pristine water from the Yoshino River, fresh air, and rich soil. One of Awa's main production places is an island called Zennyujitou. Nowadays, this large island stands among the most productive of its kind in Japan.

Producers take pride in their vegetables which they send to various markets across the city. These locally-grown vegetables (also known as the Awa Veggies) incorporate deep knowledge and long, ongoing traditions.



Awa's farmers work day after day to supply the best products on the market's shelves. Furthermore, they are doing their best to perpetuate their knowledge down to future generations called the Kids Vegetable Sommeliers. This goal is strengthened by a government that works closely and supports educational programs to ensure that the traditions will continue.





The temple of Juraku-Ji will welcome you with its trademark orange-reddish gate complimented by a large bell hung above. Juraku-Ji has attracted many visitors since its creation long ago during the reign of Kukai the Grand Master.

8th temple: Kumadani-Ji map.F-3

Kumadani-Ji temple is easily recognizable by its astonishing front gate; this entrance is one of the largest ones amongst all Shikoku temples, which makes this 8th stop of the Shikoku Pilgrimage extra special. Kirihata-Ji temple is said to have taken its name from a well-known legend in which a weaver girl offered a precious piece of cloth to the Kukai, who then made her a saint. Twice a year during the autumnal and vernal equinoxes, visitors may purchase food and unique items on the roads that lead to the temple.

A collection of artifacts is displayed in the Donari House of History, Instruments like an old charcoal burner, wooden Tarai Udon buckets, fossil remains, stone implements, and potteries from the Yavoi period reveal the old way of living in Awa. 




Chinaberry of Nogami


Iwazu no Fuchi






The Kakihara Weirs

Whether it's to admire the Awa sunset or to catch fish, the weirs is ideal for visitors who wish to relax by the water. While its main purpose is to control the water levels during heavy rains, the weirs is also the home of the ayu (sweetfish). The low water level combined with the rapid flow makes this spot attractive for these fish, and this combination produces a lovely soundtrack Kakihara, Yoshino Town, Awa City for watching the beautiful reddish-orange sundown.

Once inhabited by almost 3,000 people, this vast island serves as a large vegetable field in Awa City. It is also one of the biggest and most productive islands in Japan encompassed by grand rivers. Zennyujitou is accessible through several bridges which Shikoku pilgrims can use to travel from north to south or vice versa.

Washdown of the kyogi of Kirihata-Ji (10th temple)
